




A case of unicystic ameloblastoma of left posterior mandible treated with segmental resection and reconstruction with Total joint prosthesis(TJR). A case of a 50 yr old male diagnosed with unicystic ameloblastoma was planned for resection of the tumor followed by reconstruction using an extended TJR prosthesis which involved pre operative computerized planning with stereolithographic models, cutting guides, glenoid fossa component, replica and final prosthesis. Treatment plan included segmental resection of left posterior mandible including the coronoid and condylar processes reconstruction was done using 3D printed titanium TJR prosthesis along with glenoid fossa component.


Post operatively the patient was put under MMF for 4 weeks for muscular adaptation after which his new jaw has become fully functional.


